

The Way of the Cross at St. Paul's Fridays at 5 PM in Lent



The ancient devotion known as the Way of the Cross (or Stations of the Cross) is an adaptation to local usage of a custom widely observed by pilgrims to Jerusalem: the offering of prayer at a series of places in that city traditionally associated with our Lord's passion and death.

At St. Paul's the form of the service is taken from the *Book of Occasional Services* and is offered annually on Fridays during Lent at 5:00 PM. The stations are made before a series of carved depictions that are permanently installed in the church. Each station is a pictorial representation of the event being commemorated at that station. The stations were donated by Juanita Delgado in memory of her husband, Angel Delgado.
